RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please read important information in the front section of this book.

- All entries must be the work of the exhibitor.
- All entries must have been completed between September 2009 and September 2010 and must not have won a ribbon in any past Mountain State Fair.
- Only three carvings can be entered in each class per carver, although no carver can win more than two premiums in any one individual class.
- No kits or duplicator pieces (intarsia, marquetry, puzzles) will be accepted. Carvings from roughouts are permitted, no scroll saw works will be admitted.

- All entries must be handcarved. Power carvers and dremel type rotary tools may be used.
- All carvings must be of wood except for the special category "Other than wood". The use of molded feet of wire & putty, and glass eyes is permitted. The use of plastic or molded metallic or any other commercially manufactured parts is not permitted.
- Group Carvings-That is 2 or more pieces mounted on the same base, or as a group not mounted, will be judged as a single carving.
- The Mountain State Fair reserves the right to add, delete, or combine categories and/or classes.
- The Mountain State Fair reserves the right to refuse carvings that it considers not in good taste (i.e., nude figures, hand gestures or illegal controlled substances).
- If an entry is misrepresented or the exhibitor misrepresents his/her status, the entry will be disqualified.
- Any metal supports such as screw, wire and rods should not be visible.

AWARDS

Blue Ribbon	\$20.00	First place within a particular class.
Red Ribbon	\$12.00	Second place within a particular class.
White Ribbon	\$ 8.00	Third place within a particular class.
Best of Show	Rosette	This award represents the best entry within this subdepartment that has placed "First" in a given class within this subdepartment.
Judge's Choice	Rosette	This award represents the "judge's choice" within each category.

There are 2 categories of entrants: Exhibitor Must choose between Amateur and Professional. One CAN NOT enter both.

Amateur: A hobbyist; someone who carves for fun, who may occasionally sell a piece.

Professional: An individual who carves to sell his/her pieces, who may teach classes for pay or whose primary income is derived from teaching or selling his/her carvings.

HA001	HA014	Animals - All realistic proportion in the round carvings of animals and reptiles.
HA002	HA015	Aquatics - All realistic proportioned aquatic animals including fish, amphibians and reptiles that live in and around the water.
HA003	HA016	Birds - All realistic proportioned birds carved in the round, includes all song bird, birds of prey and upland game birds.
HA004	HA017	Waterfowl - All realistic proportioned carvings of ducks, gulls, geese, pelicans, swans, loons, shorebirds and decoys.
HA005	HA018	Chip - Any classic styled Scandinavian carving in the geometric and modern pictorial patterns on plates, boxes, spoons and furniture. Only the chip cut pattern will be judged. If the pattern is carved on a box, chest or piece of furniture that item would not be judged on the carved pattern.
HA006	HA019	Flora - All in the round carved plants, flowers, nuts, berries, bushes and trees.
HA007	HA020	Human Figures & Busts - Realistic proportioned carved human forms and bust. Only bottle stopper busts that are realistic proportioned are allowed in this class.
HA008	HA021	Caricatures - All in the round carvings with exaggerated proportions. This includes mythical figures, carousel animals, bottle stopper busts, clowns, animals, birds, humans, cartoon and storybook characters.
HA009	HA022	Relief - Two dimensional carvings in "low" and "high" relief including half round, pierced and incised carvings.
HA010	HA023	Found Wood - All carvings utilizing driftwood, knots, tree trunks, limbs or bark.
HA011	HA024	Material Other Than Wood - Items carved in material other than wood. i.e., stone, soap, glass, plastics, golf balls, peach pits, nuts and any other material not widely accepted as wood.
HA012	HA025	Pyrography - Pictures or objects burnt for design and/or effect.
HA013	HA026	Miscellaneous - Any item not already listed and/or covered in the above classes.
