RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE OPEN MEAT GOAT SHOW

1. Competition is open to all goats meeting the eligibility requirements of the American Boer Goat Association (ABGA).
2. Number of entries per exhibitor per class will not be limited, however, premiums will be paid for a maximum of two (2) placements per exhibitor per class.
3. Entry fee is \$5 per head and must be entered on the official entry form or copy of this form.
4. The Health Regulations of the Veterinary Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture will be strictly enforced. Be sure to read these under "Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering. Animals cannot be unloaded until checked in. All sheep and goats must comply with USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Guidelines. (State request form can be found behind Livestock Entry Form.)
5. No artificial coloring will be allowed.

BOER GOAT REQUIREMENTS FOR SANCTIONED ABGA SHOW ENTRIES: This show is open to all exhibitors. There is no limit on the number of animals that can be entered in a class by an exhibitor, unless the sponsoring show deems this limit absolutely necessary. Substitutions are allowed as long as the animal being substituted qualifies for the class in which it is entered.

ELIGIBILITY OF ANIMALS: All goats must be registered in the herd book of a recognized association before August 18, 2010. The original registration certificate is required. Animals must be registered in the name of the exhibitor and must have been owned by the exhibitor on or before August 18, 2010. Custom fitters, if different from Owner/Exhibitor, will register with Superintendent if Owner/Exhibitor will not be in attendance at show.

ENNOBLED HERD BOOK POINTS: Goats entered under their ABGA registration number and presenting their ABGA Certificate of Registration will be eligible to earn points for their actual placing in the show as described in the ABGA "Criteria for Ennoblement of a Boer Goat."

TATTOOS: All goats must have legible tattoo(s) or other means of permanent identification consistent with their registration certificate or the animal will be disqualified. If the animal has a microchip as its permanent identification, the exhibitor is responsible for providing a microchip reader and must bring paper.

COMPUTING AGES: Birth dates, as listed on the registration certificate, will be used to determine the class divisions. The show date will be the base date in computing all ages. Inclusive birth dates will be listed for each class.

CLASSES: All animals must be registered purebred, full blood or percentage blood Boer goats. Percentage doe class are for goats 50% to 87.5% Boer; Fullblood classes are for does that are 15/16 blood (93.7%) and higher and 31/32 blood (98.8%) and higher for bucks. Progeny of fresh does will **NOT** be allowed in the ring. The Champion and Reserve classes will be chosen from the 1st and 2nd place animals in that division of the show.

DISQUALIFICATION: Any goat showing any pronounced defect or abnormality will be barred from the showing in any of the breeding classes. **Artificial coloring will be a disqualification.** Illegible tattoos or tattoos inconsistent with registration papers will result in disqualification. Any doe over 24 months of age that has not kidded and cannot prove a current pregnancy will not be allowed to show.

BUCKS MUST BE KEPT CLEAN AND FREE OF BAD ODORS. DIRTY BUCKS WITH EXCESS BUCK ODOR WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN THE BARNS NOR WILL BE PERMITTED TO SHOW.

JUNIOR MEAT GOAT SHOW

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE JUNIOR MEAT GOAT SHOW

1. Exhibitors must be under 21 years of age as of January 1, 2010, and North Carolina residents.
2. Only wethers with all baby teeth and weighing 30 pounds and over will be allowed to show in the market classes. Market class Grand and Reserve Champion will be sold.
3. There will be two commercial doe classes: (1) does with all baby teeth and (2) does that have lost at least one baby tooth and older.
4. No animal will be allowed to enter more than one class in the Junior Meat Goat Show.
5. Each exhibitor may exhibit a total of two junior market goats and two commercial does per doe class
6. Market classes will be determined by ascending weights and age with a maximum of 15 animals per class.
7. Commercial does will be classed according to age as determined by teeth examination or exhibitor must have birthdate at time of check in.
8. The Health Regulations of the Veterinary Division of the N.C. Department of Agriculture will be strictly enforced. Be sure to read these under "Rules and Regulations of the Livestock Division" before entering. Animals cannot be unloaded until checked in. All sheep and goats must comply with USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Guidelines. (State request form can be found behind Livestock Entry Form.)

Notice: All horns should be tipped and dull for the safety of the junior exhibitors.
